#### Student-built Project House

Every year, carpentry students build a three-bedroom home that is auctioned to the highest bidder for relocation on the West Coast. The Project House build gives students the opportunity to work on a real-world project, under the watchful eye of expert tutors, and the proceeds are donated to a good local cause.

Carpentry Tutor Rick King says the students love creating something that they know will become someone's home at the end of the project. "It gives them a real sense of purpose and we enjoy fantastic support from our local tradies and suppliers, who all get behind the project and donate materials and time."

#### Bringing Dragon's Den to the West Coast

Tai Poutini Polytechnic is giving young business enthusiasts a taste of the Dragon's Den. Partnering with

the Young Enterprise Trust, each year we bring the Lion Foundation Young Enterprise Scheme to West Coast high schools. Teams of high school students are challenged to come up with a business idea, prepare a business and marketing plan and launch their product or service to the local community. Local mentors help along the way and the year ends in a final Dragon's Den-style pitch to a panel of judges.

#### West Coast Pathways Careers Expo

The annual careers event has grown in size and scale recently, offering dozens of local employers, industry representatives and trainers a chance to discuss opportunities with schools and job seekers. The expo is a unique opportunity for West Coasters to learn, face-toface, what's out there for them in our region.



While many of the Polytechnic's programmes are filling fast for the academic year, students can still enrol across a range of learning options including agriculture, engineering, business studies, foundation programmes and supported learning.

Vanessa Rankin, Leader - Student Life says the surge in interest in trades training is continuing, with many study options almost at capacity for 2022.

"We know that this is fuelled by very busy trade sectors across the West Coast, with many employers actively looking to take on Polytechnic graduates. The Government's Covid-19 Targeted Trades and Apprenticeship Fund, which makes training in some key trades free for students, is also helping to boost enrolments in these programmes.

"However there are still plenty of options for people looking to start their career or thinking about changing their focus. Places remain in a range of programmes such as agriculture, cookery, hard stone and jade carving, business, foundation and supported learning - so if people are thinking on embarking on a course of study or gaining new skills, there's still time to enrol for 2022."

### **Agriculture 2022 training flexible** to students needs

Tai Poutini Polytechnic is next year extending a new collaboration with the Primary ITO that makes it easier and more flexible for agriculture students to learn their trade and get working.

The partnership was launched at the start of 2021 as a collaboration under the new Te Pükenga national vocational education model. The key difference for West Coast learners is that they would be able to seamlessly move between learning at the polytechnic, to on the job, or back to the polytechnic without disrupting their

Tai Poutini Polytechnic Manager Teaching and Learning Peter O'Sullivan says the programme has been designed to enable and encourage students to transition into full time employment when they are ready, and to complete their studies as farm-based learners

"This is a great example of how we can pursue new ideas and partnerships under our new national education model. We want to be innovative and respond to industry, and we'll continue to adapt and change along the way as we learn from new approaches," he says.

The Polytechnic's Agriculture programme covers the basics of farm and animal management, including

operating farm machinery, key maintenance jobs like fencing, and a strong focus on health and safety on the

"As with all the trade industries around the West Coast right now, farmers are always looking for good staff who have a basic understanding of the job and can get to work straight away. Our graduates are well-regarded for the grounding they have in key farm jobs and health

"The introduction of our partnership with Primary ITO earlier last year provided a way to support farming students as they transition from study to work. This partnership will be refined and continue in 2022, allowing us to jointly support students as they respond to work opportunities," he says.

As part of the pilot programme, Primary ITO's local West Coast Training Adviser is now based at the polytechnic Greymouth campus, further supporting the development of learning pathways and engagement with local students and high schools.

Enrolments are now open for Tai Poutini Polytechnic's 2022 Agriculture training.
